Triple 7 is a record-breaking, adrenaline-fueled adventure following a group of former Special Operations soldiers on a 7-day epic journey across 7 continents to raise 1,400 life-changing scholarships in support of the families of fallen and disabled service members and first responders.

The purpose of the International Skydiving Museum & Hall of Fame® is to recognize and promote the sport of skydiving through public education and awareness; recognize the contribution to skydiving by its participants, suppliers and supporters; capture forever the history of the sport via its events, equipment, and personalities; and enhance aviation safety.

Introducing the Hall of Fame Class of 2023 . . .

Gustavo Cabana, Argentina—Inspired by his mother, Gustavo Cabana took his first pictures at the age of 6 and began to study photography at age 16, but didn't find inspiration until he saw Norman Kent's poster of the first 100-way world record. After his 70th jump, the first with a camera on his helmet, he knew what he wanted to do for the rest of his life. With his passion and perseverance, he has become one of skydiving's most accomplished photographers, with over 27,000 camera jumps in 28 countries, having photographed 29 FAI world records in formation skydiving, canopy formation and head down and head up freefly. Gustavo is the creator of Videolounge, which has been used at world championships for dubbing, sorting and judging videos. He has also collaborated with many highly regarded large formation and canopy formation teams worldwide. Gustavo designed, built and managed an oxygen system that facilitated multiple skydiving records in Europe. He has been conducting camera courses and seminars since 1998 and created the online Flying Camera School with the goal of educating and helping to make camera flying safer for both newer and experienced jumpers. In 2020, he launched the website www.gustavocabana.com to share his 30 years' worth of images with the world.



Bill Coe, USA—Bill is the founder, owner, and president of Performance Designs as well as a partner at Complete Parachute Solutions. In the summer of 1976, he entered the world of skydiving at a small drop zone in Hinckley, Illinois. There, he jumped through the winter and realized that he needed to move to a warmer place to jump year-round. On January 1, 1977, he packed up his car and moved to Daytona Beach. Bill started college at Embry Riddle Aeronautical University and started skydiving in Deland, Florida. He also worked for Relative Workshop during this time. In October of 1979, Bill got a job with Eastern Airlines and moved to Miami. He continued jumping in Homestead, Florida, and would also rent airplanes to fly back to Deland to jump and continue taking college courses. In 1980, he designed and jumped his first parachute. Several more parachutes were designed, built, and tested over the next few years. Bill graduated in 1982 with a Bachelor of Science in Aviation Technology, Cum Laude. In 1983, Performance Designs was incorporated. Bill is responsible for many innovations in the sport such as the SLink, Microline, ZP fabric and crossbracing, just to name a few. With Bill's guidance and tenacity, Performance Designs has been at the helm of countless innovations for the sport and is committed to relentlessly pursuing research and development.



Jon Devore, USA—Jon is part educator, part performer, and one-hundred percent visionary. He first found skydiving back in 1993 when he did his first tandem skydive in his hometown of Juneau, Alaska. He knew right then that he found his true passion and by 1994, he had moved to Skydive Arizona to pursue his dream of human flight. During the early days of his career, he spent his time flying with a small group of passionate skydivers helping develop and push forward what is now known as freeflying. Jon was one of the first full-time freefly coaches and, together with his team Alchemy, organized almost every freefly world record attempt. He has been a professional skydiver and cameraman for 30 years, totaling more than 22,000 skydives and BASE/wingsuit jumps. Jon is a two-time world champion, a three-time national champion and he has been the aerial coordinator of the Red Bull Air Force Stunt Team for over 20 years. His passion is human flight and he likes to teach the general public about the sport he loves. Because demonstrating his sport is the best way to advocate it, Jon has dedicated a large part of his career to coordinating skydiving demos and live shows all over the world. Jon has also applied his expertise to a number of major Hollywood feature films as a stunt coordinator, skydiving stunt performer and aerial cinematographer, including *Batman*, *Ad Astra*, *Godzilla*, *Fast and Furious 7*, *Point Break*, *The Hangover Part III*, *Iron Man* and *Iron Man 3*, *Transformers: Dark of the Moon*, *San Andreas* and most recently as aerial stunt coordinator and camera flyer for *Mission Impossible 7*. He has also overseen stunts for a range of television programs and commercials.

Introducing the Hall of Fame Class of 2023 . . .

Bill Kitchen, USA—Bill is the inventor, with technical assistance from aerospace engineer Michael Palmer, of the modern vertical tunnel skydiving simulator. Bill's first skydive was a tandem jump in 1990 from a Beech 18 at the skydive center in Ft. Collins, Colorado. He soon completed Accelerated Freefall training, continued to advance his skills and went on to earn a PRO rating. To improve his flying skills, Bill went to a wind tunnel in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, where he observed that the air in that tunnel was not smooth, and he bruised himself falling off the "column of air" in the flight area. This inspired Bill to invent an effective vertical wind tunnel freefall simulator. Bill's vertical wind tunnel design revolutionized the concept by adding a fully enclosed cylinder, resulting in the most effective skydiving training tool other than actual freefall. The invention allows a new skydiver to get the equivalent time in simulated freefall in five minutes in the tunnel they would achieve in a day of skydiving. His success has both benefited and advanced skydiving significantly.



Shannon Pilcher, USA—Shannon is a multiple-time world champion skydiver, educator, and entrepreneur who has spent 27 years traveling the globe and living a life of purpose. As a two-time formation skydiving world champion, he has coached hundreds of jumpers in the science and art of 4-way. As a co-founding member of the PD Factory Team, he has amassed three world records and numerous world medals. Also, with the PDFT, he co-pioneered descents of some of the world's most iconic mountain peaks, including the Italian Dolomites, French Alps, Norwegian fjords, the Grand Canyon, and the Nepali Himalayas. As a co-founding member of Flight-1, he has taught thousands of civilian and military canopy pilots, helping to usher in a paradigm-shifting culture of canopy safety around the world. Shannon has dedicated the last five years of his journey to coaching multi-national leadership teams and their leaders to reach their highest potential. He holds a master's degree in organization development from American University and a bachelor's degree in building construction from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He lives in DeLand, Florida, with his wife and five-year-old daughter, and spends his summers in Israel with his wife's family.

Path of Excellence Award Goes to Skydivers Over Sixty (SOS)!

Skydivers Over Sixty, a subgroup of Parachutists Over Phorty Society, was formed in 1992 at the annual POPS Wintermeet held at Jimmy Godwin's drop zone in Umatilla, Florida. The first SOS 10-Way included many notables of the sport, such as Max Miensopust, Danny Hupert, Bill Wood, Lew Sanborn, Pat Moorehead, Tom Morrison, Bob Sinclair, J.D. Williams, Len Zak and Walter Ross,



some who are still active jumpers. The occasion was a celebration of the 60th birthday of SOS founder Pat Moorehead, and the decision was made that all dues and



sales from the SOS store would be donated to support the U.S. Parachute Team Trust Fund.

In the ensuing 27 years, SOS has donated over \$32,000 to the fund. In addition, SOS has donated over \$5,000 to the International Skydiving Museum.

Interestingly, SOS includes people with thousands of jumps and some with just a few, and they do what they do because of the camaraderie and good times. SOS takes great pride in knowing that many skydivers who reach this special age continue to hone their skills and actively participate in POPS and SOS competitions around the world. The World POPS Meet has, for many years, included a SOS Division, and the U.S. World SOS teams have collected gold several times. The U.S. chapter has also inspired many other countries to form their own versions of SOS with the same results: camaraderie and good times.

SOS has inspired skydivers of "a certain age" to remain active in the sport—or to rejoin the fun after years of not jumping because of various issues. There are over 2,650 members of SOS from 30 countries, most still skydiving. And they truly believe that "60 is the new 40."

Pioneers of Excellence Award Goes to the Golden Knights, the US Army Parachute Team—the Most Successful Parachute Competition Teams in History

Since 1959, the Golden Knights competition teams have fully dedicated themselves to establishing and continuing a rich and storied



legacy, interwoven with that of the national and international skydiving communities. The Knights have always been exemplary role models: sportsmanship, teamwork, fitness, dedication, hard work, perseverance—all the qualities it takes to make champions.



In 1959, Brigadier General Joseph Stilwell formed the Strategic Army Command Parachute Team, or STRAC, with the original mission to compete during the Cold War effort. This new U.S. all-Army team, comprised of 19 Airborne enlisted soldiers, swept the international accuracy competition circuit in what was then the Soviet-dominated sport of skydiving.

In 1961, the team would be formally activated and redesignated as the United States Army Parachute Team (USAPT). The team earned the nickname "The Golden Knights" for their dominance in competition. "Golden," signifying the gold medals the team had won; "Knights," proving they "conquered the skies" as world champions.

Over the coming decades, the accuracy competition teams evolved, creating the style and accuracy and 4-way/8-way skydiving teams and later adding canopy relative work (CRW), canopy piloting (CP) and vertical formation skydiving (VFS) teams. There is no other team in the history of skydiving that extends so far into almost every aspect of the sport.

The Golden Knights competition teams sport an impressive record of more than 460 national champion, 100 world champion, 54 national and 45 world team titles. The teams have earned 2,492 gold medals, 1,307 silver medals and 750 bronze medals. Over the past 63 years, the U.S. Army Parachute Team has broken 348 world records, including military records held in the Councail International du Sports Militaire (CISM). Their outstanding contribution to the sport has been sustained continuously since 1959.
